Z-1 APPLICATION A04-11-002 UNIVERSITY OF TEXAS HEALTH AND SCIENCE CENTER AT TYLER ANNEXATION

Request that the City consider adopting an Ordinance providing for the voluntary annexation of the University of Texas Health and Science Center at Tyler. The proposed annexation area consists of approximately 593.11 acres lying adjacent to the present boundary limits of the City of Tyler at the southwest intersection of State Highway 271 and State Highway 155. Also consider recommending:

- A. The new boundary of the City Limits.
- B. The new boundary of the Extraterritorial Jurisdiction.
- C. The new boundary of the City Council District No. 3.
- D. The Future Land Use Guide be updated to reflect General Commercial Land Use.
- E. Original zoning of "INT", Institutional District and "C-2" General Commercial District. (O-2012-16)

Dr. Kirk Calhoun, President – Stated that on the behalf of the Board of Regents of the University of Texas Systems he wanted to thank the City Council for considering their request and for taking action today. The University of Texas Health Science Center at Tyler is a regional resource however, we felt a very important part of the City of Tyler family and now we are legal in the family. O-2 Request that the City Council consider adopting an Ordinance amending the Tyler City Code Section 18-31 to make certain maintenance, health, and screening regulations applicable to the commercial storage facilities exception. (O-2012-24)

Motion by Mayor Pro Tem Mezayek; seconded by Councilmember Whatley; motion carried 7 - 0 & approved as presented.

O-3 Request that the City Council consider adopting an Ordinance amending Tyler City Code Chapter 18 to add definitions and to establish procedures for abatement and removal of certain trees on private property or within the adjacent parkway, and, due to condition, disease, damage or insect infestation or other factors, constitute threats to the public health and safety on public property or public right-of-way. (O-2012-25)

<u>City Attorney, Gary Landers</u> – Stated that this item is an extension of regulations of trees growing close to streets and right of ways. Across the City of Tyler sometimes our streets are owned by the City with a deed, but most of our streets are owned by the adjacent property owners and the deed goes out to the middle of the street. It is not unusual to have regulations regulating what we call the right of way or parkway. This one is a health and safety issue and there is authority for it under state law. Literally the steps you go through if a specific tree is determined to be so dangerous and a danger of falling over then it becomes a public nuisance, and it's the authority of a City through the State to regulate nuisances.

<u>Councilmember Heines</u> – Asked if this would get to the point that if two homeowners have a tree and one of the homeowner's tree is hanging over on the other person's lot maybe falling over on someone else's house then we will not get into that with this ordinance.

<u>City Attorney, Gary Landers</u>- Stated that this is not what this ordinance is aimed at, this ordinance is aimed at covering the situation where there is a tree that is becoming a nuisance or danger to the publicly traveled areas.

<u>Councilmember Mezayek</u> – Stated that it was discussed that a lot of the lots and streets were owned where the deed of the property goes out to the middle of the street, and I know that's part of what the City has, a majority of them are streets that the City owns the right of way or the right of way is dedicated to the City. Councilmember Mezayek stated that he was a little concerned because the City is telling a private citizen that if a tree is sitting in the City right of way maybe by their front yard, or grass they mow, or between the sidewalk and street that the

homeowner now will be responsible to remove the tree if its deemed by the Arborist to be a nuisance?

<u>City Attorney, Gary Landers</u> – Stated, "Yes, because the homeowner is already responsible for maintaining or taking care of the property anyway." This provides a way for the City to actually step in when there is a nuisance, when the owner is not maybe being a responsible owner and not taking care of that tree.

<u>Councilmember Mezayek</u> – Stated that in a 60 foot right of way the street is typically 33 foot wide and you would have from behind the curb to the property line and the home owner would be about 13 ½ feet on each side. The way the ordinance is written that if a tree is sitting in that right of way not actually on the person's property the homeowner would basically be responsible for the tree.

Councilmember Whatley – Asked what instances have come up that is driving this ordinance

City Manager, Mark McDaniel - Stated that we received one major complaint regarding a lot of dead trees that had a threat of falling into the roadway but they were on private property. With the drought that we had there are a lot of dead trees and we just want to get ahead of things. The area that's in front of your house a lot of times will have easements for utilities and all sorts of things but the property owner still owns it, it's just an easement. If the tree is in the easement that the property owner still owns that's the kind of case where we will be requiring the owner to deal with it. If it's clearly a right of way issue and it's really our tree most of the time Robin will just go out there and take the tree out because he doesn't need permission to because it's on our right of way.

<u>Councilmember Mezayek</u> – Stated that he does not have an issue with that but if it's on someone private property and its definitely an health and safety issue and the City says look you need to take care of this, then that's okay. But the way the ordinance is written talks about the right of way, anything in the right of way and that could mean the City right of way, is the way it's written. The City of Tyler has a lot of lots in the city right of way that the city owns.

<u>City Manager, Mark McDaniel</u> – Stated that this definitely was a gray area because that area is defined in different ways and different parts of town whether it's a parkway, an easement, or a right of way, whether we own it out right or not.

<u>Councilmember Mezayek</u> – Asked if there was a way that it can be defined if it's outside the cities property line?

<u>City Attorney, Gary Landers</u> – Stated that the ordinance also refers to property owner so in the situation where the City is the property owner of that right of way we should be talking to ourselves and that is the situation normally now if there is situations like that we would research it and if it's the City responsibility then the street department will take care of it.

<u>Councilmember Caraway</u> – Asked if it has already been determined who it actually belongs to either the City or the property owner?

<u>City Attorney, Gary Landers</u> – Stated that would have to be part of this process.

Motion by Mayor Pro Tem Mezayek; seconded by Councilmember Caraway; motion carried 7 - 0 & approved as presented.

O-4 Request that the City Council consider adopting an Ordinance amending City Code Chapter 6 by amending the fencing and enclosure requirements related to swimming pools in Single-Family Residential Zones, and amending the definition of "swimming pool" to conform to State law. (O-2012-26)
