EMPLOYEE AWARDS - RECOGNITIONS, SERVICE

A-1 Request that the City Council consider recognizing the members of the 2013 Tyler Firefighter Combat Challenge Teams.

<u>Fire Chief, Tim Johnson</u>- Stated that the City of Tyler hosted the Brookshires' Regional Firefighter Combat Challenge event on Friday, October 4 and Saturday, October 5, 2013. Individuals, Relay Teams and Tandem Teams competed, representing several different fire departments from across the country. The event, held in the Broadway Square Mall parking lot, drew large crowds of onlookers.

Two Tyler Fire Department Relay Teams and one City of Tyler Employee Corporate Challenge Team competed. Competitors came from Texas, Oklahoma, New Mexico, Nebraska, Indiana, and South Carolina.

The Firefighter over 40 Team, consisting of Jeff Barnett, Brandon Davis, Brent Hail, Terry Hawkins and Randy Lee came in 1st Place and qualified to compete in the World Competition at the end of this month.

The Firefighter Open Challenge Team consisting of Brian Boyd, Jeremy Driver, Jeff Hudgens, Patrick Mayo and Jay McClung came in 3rd Place against 26 other teams.

The City of Tyler Corporate Challenge Team consisting of Doug Coffman, Luke Porter, Leroy Sparrow and Jimmy Vega ran in an exhibition race without any firefighter gear, against 3 other teams and won 1st Place.

<u>Shari Bickman, 315 N. Broadway</u> – Gave an update on how much income the Firefighter Combat Challenge brought in and also thanked the volunteers and the City Council for their support of the Firefighter Combat Challenge.

Russ Jackson, Solid Waste/Vehicle Services Manager — Stated that Roosth Production Company is an oil and gas operator with mineral leases on City of Tyler property, in the vicinity of CR 398, adjacent to the Jackson Heights Addition. The Solid Waste Department administers the subject tract as future landfill space.

Roosth Production Company has obtained leases on the subject Solid Waste tract of land where the City owns only the surface estate and is seeking to explore, drill and produce oil and gas on this Solid Waste tract. The Solid Waste Department has used attorney Richard Ring to assist with negotiating a surface use agreement that is protective of City interests in the surface estate.
