CITY MANAGER'S REPORT

- 1. Thompson Ave and Barger St are finished! This was a Half Cent project that salvaged approximately 101,015 historic bricks for use elsewhere in the future. The storm drain system was failing over on Thompson St, so it was replaced, as were the water lines, water taps, and water services in that area, and the sewer main, sewer taps, and sewer services. We also added sidewalks, and improved other sidewalks in that area with the goals of not needing to cut this new asphalt pavement for years and encourage some redevelopment of this part of Tyler.
- 2. The Keaton Ave Draining project is also being funded by the Half Cent sales tax project and is out for bidding right now. The problem has been water over topping the channel (blue line) at Keaton Ave (red arrow) and flowing down Keaton Ave and back into the channel at Shepherd Ln. We will be diverting flows from the channel at Keaton Ave, down new storm drains in Keaton, and back into an enlarged concrete channel from Shepherd to Wynnwood Dr. We also will do some erosion repair in the natural channel between Keaton Ave and Bain Pl, and repair the masonry channel from Fry Ave. Keep your fingers crossed for some great bid pricing!
- 3. Water Main Line Break: Tyler Water Utilities had a line break that led to low pressures in the system on Monday morning, April 22. Beginning at 7:30 am, a portion of the City experienced little to no pressure based on a plug coming lose from a dead-end 18" water line at Earl Campbell and Loop 323. The break was isolated, and pressures are back up based on tank levels in the area. The area was determined based on the 16" line we saw lose pressure and the majority of the complaints coming from the area bounded by Eisenhower/Ambrose (with the exception of the Airport on 64) on the West, Loop 323 on the East, Highway 64 on the North and spur 364 on the south. There are approximately 3,404 connections that are affected by the leak. We have issued a boil water notice for the impacted area. We expect to be able to take samples as early as noon on Tuesday, as the repairs may be completed tonight. This will put us on a schedule to have the boil water notice lifted on Wednesday afternoon.
