### V. MAYOR ANNOUNCES OFFICIAL KICK-OFF to "PRESERVATION MONTH":

- a. Today marks the kick-off event for Preservation Month in Tyler. "Celebrating America's Treasures" is the theme of the month-long celebration sponsored by the National Trust for Historic Preservation.
- b. The month-long celebration is designed to highlight preservation efforts within our community through events ranging from architectural and historic tours and award ceremonies, to fundraising events, educational programs and heritage travel opportunities.
- c. Everyone is invited to come out and learn how to preserve and restore their historic properties at the 'Love Your Old House Fair' on Saturday, May 7 from noon to 5 p.m. at the Tyler Woman's Building.

# VI. MAYOR EXPLAINS "REFLECTIONS" PROGRAM:

- a. In accordance with the Tyler 21 North End Action Plan, in 2009, the City of Tyler launched a three year program to promote Tyler Historic Landmarks status and the installation of historic markers and plaques at North End locations important to city history, including the history of the African-American community.
- b. The Reflections Program encourages citizens or interested organizations to submit nominations for the designation in the North End as Tyler Historic Landmarks, Tyler Historic Subject Markers or Half Mile of History markers.
- c. Today we will be honoring the fifth REFLECTIONS recipient, Katie A. Stewart.
- d. And now I would like to introduce City Council Member Donald Sanders who will share about the Subject Marker program and some history about Katie Albert Stewart.

# VII. DONALD SANDERS makes comments about program:

a. I am very pleased that we, the City of Tyler, have fulfilled another of the goals set forth in Tyler 21 which is to establish a program to encourage the

acknowledgement of Tyler landmarks and historic markers in the northern area of Tyler.

b. This program is important because it is impossible to know where you are going if you can't see where you have been. Capturing our history and educating our children about their heritage is the responsibility of each of us in this community. I feel this program will encourage us all to reflect upon the significant moments in our history and preserve those for the future.

## VIII. DONALD SANDERS reads history of Katie Albert Stewart:

Katie A. Stewart, the only child of the Reverend Dr. Albert Thomas and Garthelia Willeta Harris Stewart, learned from her parents the value of an education, and the everlasting impact of one's contribution to the community. Her life was an example of true dedication of commitment to the teaching and training of children, youth and young adults, both in the educational systems and in organized church work. All through her life she gave credit to her parents for this example. It is for this strategic modeling that Stewart Middle School in the Tyler Independent School District bears her father's name.

Katie A. Stewart's education opened the doors of opportunity for her to teach and train children at T.J. Austin Elementary School and Emmett Scott High School.

Her church and community affiliations also received the benefit of her gifts and talents. These include the East Texas Chapter of the Links, Delta Sigma Theta Sorority Inc., the Utopia Civic and Art Club, and her church home, True Vine Baptist Church. Her deepest and closest friend, Helen Brewer and Helen's family, continues to be her family today.

Education: Miss Katie A. Stewart attended elementary school in Helena Arkansas. Her parents moved to Tyler when she was very young. She attended the East Texas Academy and graduated from the Colored High School (later named Emmett J. Scott) in Tyler where she received a Diploma on June 7, 1918. The principal was Mr. Thos. J. Austin. Miss Stewart attended Prairie View A & M University where she received a Bachelor of Science Degree. She attended Atlanta University and received a Master of Education Degree. Additional Study Include: Columbia University-New York, NY, Chicago University - Chicago, IL, and University of Western Reserve - Cleveland, OH.

Occupation: Retired High School and College English Teacher after 46 years. Her first job was Emmett J. Scott High School, where she began working in 1923 and ended May 30, 1969 after 46 years. She taught English, Government, Drama, Speech, and Reading. Miss Stewart sponsored several departments: The Drama Department, Head of the English Department, Sponsored the Debate Team and Coached Girls Basketball. She Won First Place in Drama and Debate. She Also taught at T. J. Austin Elementary, Tyler Junior College, Texas College (summer sessions), and Prairie View College (summer sessions).

Marriage: Never Married

Affiliations: True Vine Baptist Church: Lifetime member where she joined under the pastorate of Rev. Harvey Alexander. Sunday School Teacher, First and only Church Clerk, Past Superintendent of Sunday School, East Texas Chapter of Links, Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc., Texas Retired Teachers Association, Smith County Retired School Personnel Association, Utopia Civic & Art Club.

- From the State of Texas, Representative Leo Berman presented to Miss Stewart a "Certificate of Citation" for 103 years old and for her 46 years of Service as an Educator.

- Received a "Certificate of Appreciation" 1996 from the True Vine Baptist Church for Dedicated and Invaluable Service in Reaching and Teaching Persons through Sunday School

- The Entire Emmett Scott Reunion 2000 was dedicated to Miss Stewart
