RESOLUTION

R-1 Request that the City Council consider adopting a resolution to authorize the application for and acceptance of Federal Transit Administration (FTA) 5307 Grant Funds in the amount of \$1,846,444 for the purpose of providing public transportation for the City of Tyler and section 5339 Bus and Bus Facilities Grant in the amount of \$239,899 along with the acceptance of \$59,975 in Transportation Development Credits (TDC). This resolution also accepts any grant amendments and additional TDC's to increase the grant funding levels and reduce the local match requirements. (R-2019-49)

<u>Tim Russell (Sunnybrook Drive)</u> – Spoke in favor of the item, and challenged the Council members to ride the City's public transportation system whenever possible. Mr. Russell mentioned that frequency of route pickups is something he would like the Council to consider when reviewing its public transportation system upgrades.
