Z-1 Z17-008 TYLER INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICT (5201 NEW COPELAND ROAD)

Request that the City Council consider approving a zone change from "R-1A" Single-Family Residential District to "RPO", Restricted Professional Office District. (O-2017-35)

Z-3 S17-001 NELIDA VALLE (615 CLUB CIRCLE)
Request that the City Council consider approving a Special Use Permit to allow for a front yard fence for an indefinite period of time. (O-2017-37)

<u>Councilmember Moore</u> – Stated that fences are becoming an issue in his district and the yards look like prison yards, so he cannot continue to vote for fencing in his area whether it's a four foot or an eight foot.

Nelida Valle, 615 Club Circle – Stated that there are a lot of issues in the neighborhood and because of one complaint she is having this issue. Mrs. Valle stated that she has had burglaries at her house, and random people coming up to her house before the fence was put up. Mrs. Valle stated that before the fence was an old chain link fence, but she took it down and improved it; so she would like to keep the fence at four foot if possible.

CITY MANAGER'S REPORT

- 1. Since January 1, 2017, Animal Services has received 2,853 calls for service. They have found adoptive homes for 78 cats and dogs and returned 113 pets to their owners; 246 animals were transferred to rescue partners, and there is a 5.29 percent euthanasia rate for the space.
- 2. On Tuesday, May 9, the City of Tyler Parks Department and Texas A&M Forest Service (TFS) will have a crew mulching the understory along a portion of Rose Rudman Trail. The mulching project is being done to reduce safety concerns of users, increase aesthetics of the trail, remove invasive species, and mitigate hazardous fuel in the wildland urban interface (W.U.I.) The portion to be closed is the length of trail from Rieck Road moving south to Grande Boulevard on Rose Rudman.
- 3. Troup Highway water line tank & pump station project upcoming completion.
- 4. Tyler Police Department Annual Report for 2016 now available providing crime statistics.
- 5. CIP Council summary report was passed out to Councilmembers for review.
