PRESENTATIONS

P-1 Request that the City Council consider receiving a presentation from the Engineering Department regarding the pavement management program for the City of Tyler.

<u>Carter Delleney, City Engineer</u>- Stated that the Engineering Department manages two annual pavement programs. These programs include the Asphalt Enhancement Program and the Seal Coat Program. To help effectively determine pavement conditions and more efficiently use budgets for the pavement management programs, Fugro was hired in 2012 to collect data citywide and perform an analysis for the City of Tyler's streets.

The data from this analysis, which was completed in 2013, is utilized in selecting street candidates for the annual pavement programs. Streets are selected by considering the pavement condition index (PCI) that is calculated from the data collection.

Various budget scenarios were analyzed for the existing asphalt pavement network to determine how different funding levels affect the overall street network PCI. By analyzing these budget scenarios staff can determine how to best utilize City funds from the Half Cent Sales Tax and the General Fund while maintaining higher quality and safer roadways.

<u>Adrienne Leach, Project Engineer and Reuben Williams</u> – Gave a brief update on the Pavement Management Program Report.
