CITY MANAGER'S REPORT

- 1. Starting next month we will have NeT Health come in monthly and do a presentation and discussion on the status of the COVID-19 pandemic and what is going on in the community.
- 2. A couple of road projects that are happening is on Grande there is an issue that we're working on. AE Shull continues to work on the storm drain repair on East Grande between Rhones Quarter Road and Hwy 110. They have completed the repair under the road and have moved on to repair the median and what that means is that they would open 1 eastbound Lane for through traffic as of this past Monday, then the east bound lane closed for the workers to make the repair in the median. AE Shull is looking to have the median and everything completed and open by the end of this week.
- 3. On the Martin Luther King Jr. Blvd corridor enhancements project the construction of the sidewalk is about 50% complete and construction of the storm sewer near North Parkdale Drive is about 75% complete, the Union Pacific Railroad has replaced their railroad crossing on MLK and they are waiting for proposal to replace several damaged signal poles at Palace.
- 4. Now even though COVID-19 going on and just so much of everything kind of shut down or kind of put in quarantine mode, Keep Tyler Beautiful is continuing to work with the community for volunteer efforts. Last week, they hosted a two day event for 26 volunteers from Hands up Network, they had students from Flint Baptist students Ministry that took on five beautification projects as part of their summer camp experience and these paintings include 30 plus feet of concrete steps of Fun Forest pool that they painted and the green metal building at Hillside Park soccer field. This week Keep Tyler Beautiful hosted a three day event for 20 young volunteers from Trinity Lutheran Church and this volunteer groups served over 135 service hours with hands on projects including litter cleanup at Southside Trails and Parks and restoring flower beds at the Goodman Museum and removing weeds from the native plant garden.
- 5. We worked with the County on jury selection, we used the Rose Garden center last week. They needed it in order for Judge Kennedy to select the grand juries and with that we needed to have a place large enough here in Tyler with Smith County in order to host that so we were able to do that at the Rose Garden Center where we installed portable metal detectors, temperature checks, social distancing directions on the floor and a mocked up courtroom.

- 6. One of the things that have been of concern for us has been with seniors in our community. Now with the Senior Center shut down and the concern about especially the adverse impact the COVID-19 has on the seniors, we've been very careful, by asking them to stay at home as much as possible. But this is a group that does need to have some type of socialization and so one of the things that the library staff has taken on as a special project and that is to ask the public to drop off letters or just submit letters for the Tyler Senior Center folks to cheer up their days. So we're going to take those and make sure that those get out to our senior citizens who are part of our different programs.
- 7. As a last note to continue in the programs we have is Texure size. It's a program for many of our seniors in our city. They get their exercise from it, it's an opportunity for them to get up to do dancing and also get exercise at the same time. We had a resident reach out to us, she was having issues viewing the program on channel 3, so Bob Mauldin went to the rescue for this one. We want to give him a special thank you for his called to serve spirit, he copied the program to a DVD and personally delivered it out to her where she lives close out to the airport. Sadly, the equipment is too old to play the DVD, but we do appreciate Bob taking that on, volunteering to put that together for her knowing that she wanted to be able to just participate with that more, and so we appreciate that thought and actions that he put into that.
