NNO TM PROGRAM HOURS

Your NNO[™] celebration should be held on the 1ST Tuesday of October. Officer visitations will be conducted between 5:00 PM − 9:00 PM.

OFFICER-VISITATIONS

Officers from the Tyler Police Department will schedule time to visit with residents at each NNOTM celebration location. In order to accomplish this, the Police Department must receive a registration form from every celebration site no later than September 30, 2022.

If the location or time of your NNOTM celebration changes, please notify the Police Department as soon as possible by calling (903) 531-1096. Changes in celebration time made after September 30th may result in that celebration location not being visited. Regardless of the weather, officer visitations will be made.

Although TPD officers look forward to visiting each of the NNOTM celebration locations, it is important to remember that their primary responsibility is emergency response. Due to this, officers may be called away from a celebration or, in some cases, miss it entirely. If the officer(s) scheduled to visit a particular celebration cannot attend it, other officers will *try* to fill-in.

Remember that the deadline for registering your celebration and getting on the officer visitation list is September 30, 2022.

NNOTM CELEBRATION REGISTRATION FORMS

NNOTM Celebration registration forms will be used only for scheduling officer visitations. Requests for barricades will also be noted on the forms.

Neighborhood Block Captains will receive the forms by mail or email, no later than the end of August.
