## Notice of Public Hearing on Tax Increase and Proposed Budget

The <u>City of Tyler</u> will hold two public hearings on the proposed Fiscal Year 2022-2023 budget and tax increase.

The first public hearing will be held on <u>August 24, 2022 at 9 a.m.</u> at <u>Tyler City Hall, 212 N. Bonner Ave, Tyler, Texas.</u>

The second public hearing will occur prior to adoption on <u>September 14, 2022</u> at <u>9 a.m.at Tyler City Hall</u>, <u>212 N. Bonner Ave, Tyler, Texas.</u>

A tax rate of \$0.26185 per \$100 valuation has been proposed by the governing body of City of Tyler.

PROPOSED TAX RATE \$0.261850 per \$100

NO-NEW-REVENUE TAX RATE \$0.244811 per \$100

VOTER-APPROVAL TAX RATE \$0.261850 per \$100

The no-new-revenue tax rate is the tax rate for the <u>2022</u> tax year that will raise the same amount of property tax revenue for <u>City of Tyler</u> from the same properties in both the <u>2021</u> tax year and the <u>2022</u> tax year.

The voter-approval tax rate is the highest tax rate that <u>City of Tyler</u> may adopt without holding an election to seek voter approval of the rate.

The proposed tax rate is greater than the no-new-revenue tax rate. This means that <u>City of Tyler</u> is proposing to increase property taxes for the <u>2022</u> tax year.

A PUBLIC HEARING ON THE PROPOSED TAX RATE WILL BE HELD ON <u>August 24</u>, 2022 at 9 a.m. at <u>Tyler City Hall</u> AND ON <u>September 14</u>, 2022 at 9 a.m. at <u>Tyler City Hall</u>.

The proposed tax rate is not greater than the voter-approval tax rate. As a result, <u>City of Tyler</u> is not required to hold an election at which voters may accept or reject the proposed tax rate. However, you may express your support for or opposition to the proposed tax rate by contacting the members of the <u>City Council</u> of <u>City of Tyler</u> at their offices or by attending the public hearing mentioned above.

YOUR TAXES OWED UNDER ANY OF THE TAX RATES MENTIONED ABOVE CAN BE CALCULATED AS FOLLOWS:

Property tax amount = (tax rate) x (taxable value of your property) / 100

The members of the governing body voted on the proposal to consider the tax rate as follows:

The 86th Texas Legislature modified the manner in which the voter-approval tax rate is calculated to limit the rate of growth of property taxes in the state.

This budget will raise more total property taxes than last year's budget by \$2,038,668 which is a 7.54% increase from last year's budget, and of that amount \$462,604 is tax revenue to be raised from new property added to the tax roll this year.
