M-1 Motion by Councilmember Westbrook to approve the January 26, 2022 minutes; seconded by Councilmember Curtis; motion carried 7 - 0 & approved as presented.

CITY MANAGER'S REPORT

- 1. Ratification of the appointment of Darin Jennings as City Engineer.
- 2. The Tyler Parks and Rec Department is beginning renovations to Noble E. Young Park, located at 3125 Seaton St. For the duration of the project, the park will be closed out of concern for safety. Noble E. Young Park will be receiving a new pavilion, restrooms, a walking trail, playground equipment and outdoor exercise equipment that includes some ADA-compliant pieces. These renovations will be paid for by the Community Development Block Grant Program and should be completed by August 2022.
- 3. The Parks Department is making improvements to the medians around the loop.
- 4. Tyler Parks and Rec was one of 41 organizations across the state to be named a recipient of the 2022 Texas Parks and Wildlife Department's CO-OP (Community Outdoor Outreach Program). We will receive \$16,345 to fund the Outdoor Adventure Series at Glass Rec Center. This is the third time the Outdoor Adventure Series has received funding from this grant totaling more than \$60,000.
- 5. With the start of 2022, the library began holding Pop Up Programs for kids with a special emphasis on providing fun activities and challenges for children that visit after school!
